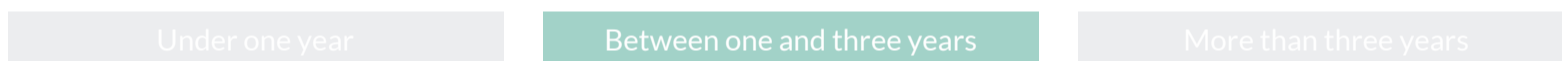
PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT OBJECTIVE(DESCRIPTION)
